


AJO GARDEN SELF-GUIDED TOUR

Ajo is working to create a sustainable local food system and promote a healthier way of living for all of the area residents. We are doing this through the distributed agriculture model, i.e. growing food in a variety of backyard, neighborhood, community, and farm gardens, conducting workshops on gardening and cooking, and organizing a twice-monthly Authentically Ajo Farmers Market.

The gardens listed here are part of the Ajo Regional Food Partnership (ARFP). Details of each are listed on the back of this map.



AJO GARDEN SELF-GUIDED TOUR

1 Edible Ajo School Yard (EASY)

Managed by Desert Senita Community Health Center in partnership with AUSD

Elementary School Courtyard, Ajo Unified School District - 111 N Well Rd

Stop at the school office for a visitors pass.

This outdoor classroom is host to mandatory garden classes for pre-K thru 6th grades. Along with garden hands-on activities, curriculum focus is plant science, pollinators, social studies and nutrition while revealing community values and land stewardship. Harvest is enjoyed by students.

2 Authentically Ajo Farmers Market

3 Many Hands Urban Farm and Learning Center

Ajo Center for Sustainable Agriculture (ACSA)

Curley School campus, entrance from 201 Esperanza Ave and 55 Orilla Ave

ACSA was established in 2008 as a community-based grassroots non-profit organization dedicated to developing a sustainable and just food system in Ajo, AZ. ACSA supports Ajo gardeners through Ajo Gardeners Network, which offers workshops, seeds, seedlings, compost distributions, and TA. ACSA established and runs run bi-weekly Authentically Ajo farmers market. ACSA is a founding member of Ajo Regional Food Partnership. This 1/2 acre urban farm serves as ACSA's main teaching site. It includes Courtyard Garden, heirloom orchard, and chicken coop and represents a complete small-scale sustainable agricultural system. Many Hands Experimental and Demonstration Garden is currently being revived to feature several teaching elements such as kids' corner, seed garden, dry-land traditional O'odham garden, raised urban beds, and solar-powered greenhouse. 5 Loma Bonita Orchard and Garden

Begun in January of 2011, our garden is a legal AZ non-profit corporation. You may enter this garden from the alley below (between Esperanza and Morondo). Say hello to the chickens as you walk up to the central compost bins and the top ramada. Sit a while and enjoy the view! We grow numerous fruit trees (apple, plum, peach, fig, apricot, aprium, cherry), as well as grapes, berries, vegetables, and roses. Close the gate securely.

6 Community Garden – Ajo 1st Assembly of God Church site

ACGC, established 2007, is a volunteer operated organization that provides an opportunity to all Ajo residents to lead a healthy lifestyle by growing crops. Gardeners harvest from their own plot, volunteer to harvest for the Ajo Food Pantry, and/or for the Authentically Ajo Farmers Market to raise funds for water use and other needs. The ACGC Healing Labyrinth area is sponsored by the Desert Senita Community Health Center's Behavioral Health Department for counseling needs, aroma therapy and relaxation activities, but is open for all visitors to enjoy. 7 Dolce Vita Market Garden

8 St Vincent's Thrift Store

1500 Washington

Demonstration container gardens, including "pallet" gardens. Anything grown there is eventually given free.

The store is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 10 a.m. – 3 p.m.

9 Roping Arena Field

Ajo Center for Sustainable Agriculture (ACSA)

North on Well Rd, past the Ajo Landfill
